ECON7760 Infographic and Presentation Task Sheet

**Instructions:** 

This assessment item requires you to create an infographic poster (20%) and video presentation (15%). Students must submit both components of the assignment to be eligible for marks. Your infographic

must answer the following question.

**Infographic Topic:** 

Create an engaging and informative infographic poster that critically evaluates the expansion of emissions trading schemes (ETS) globally. Provide insights into the

economic implications.

As part of the task, you must record a 2-3-minute presentation on the infographic explaining the

purpose and analysis provided by the infographic. Students are required to be physically and clearly visible in the recording. We recommend using Zoom, Microsoft Teams, or the Record function in PowerPoint to record your infographic presentation to ensure your face is visible in the recording. Your

infographic can be designed in Word, PowerPoint or using online tools but the poster must be submitted

as a PDF format.

The assignment must be submitted electronically through the Online Submission links in the

Assessment section of the Course Blackboard site. There is one submission portal for the infographic

and one for the video.

Penalties will be applied for speaking too quickly in the recording and/or for exceeding 3 minutes

maximum.

Deadline for Submission: 15th September, 3pm

Tips:

Do your research before designing your infographic. Think about the key points you want to

convey. Don't forget the elements of economic analysis that are required.

Ensure that your infographic/slide provides a cohesive picture of the problem and effectively

convey your critical assessment.

Do not rely solely on lecture notes. You are required to research and evidence your claims

using appropriate sources.
